



## Collaborative Autism Training and Support (CATS)

Enriching the lives of children with autism spectrum disorders and their families by providing direct care, family education, training service providers and raising local awareness of autism.

### CATS program offers:

- A supervised Sonoma State University Student to work one-on-one with your child in your home for 10-12 weeks per semester.
- Support group for parents, networking, and up-to-date autism information and educational resources.
- Free SSU library privileges and parking passes for enrolled families.

- Access to English and native Spanish-speaking CATS personnel for information, advocacy and support.
- Contact information for a pool of students available for additional paid respite work.

- North Bay Regional Center (NBRC) is a vendor for the CATS program. Please contact your Client Program Coordinator or Early Intervention Specialist to see if your child will qualify for this program.
